At the heart of our Northcott Young Company activities are our weekly classes, run during school term time. Because of ever-increasing demand, we now run age-appropriate sessions for young people ages 9 to 21.

We are currently piloting a new group for 5-8 year-olds and plan to roll this

We are currently piloting a new group for 5-8 year-olds and plan to roll this out as part of the core offer in the autumn.

Over the years, we've got to know talented young people who didn't want to leave when they turned 17. They inspired us to kick off a new group for ages 17-21, designed to further develop their skills and keep challenging them. Every term, they get the opportunity to work together with industry professionals, who provide insight into their theatre-making processes. The group has already collaborated with **Le Navet Bete** and are currently working with local panto legend and classically trained actor **Steve Bennett.**

Next term, they will be joined by performer, director, deviser and musician **Siân Keen** from Scratchworks and Running Dog Theatre.

FUTURES

The Futures Programme provides mentoring and training opportunities to artists and producers throughout the South West, enabling them to kickstart or reinvigorate their careers. The programme costs £50 and is open to anyone over the age of eighteen.

This year, we have widened access to the Futures programme, which was initially delivered entirely in-person at the theatre, by offering a mix of in-person and online learning, and we have teamed up with other South West-based organisations, most recently **Culture Weston** in Weston-Super-Mare, to help facilitate the programme. Two emerging producers received Futures places through this partnership. It is cultural networks like these that can remove entry barriers into the theatre industry in the South West.

All early-career artists and producers on the Futures Programme are given the opportunity to work with **Helen Bovey**, the Northcott's Artist Development Producer, and connect with each other's work.

FOR PRODUCERS

Budding producers are learning about a wide range of subjects, including budgeting, fundraising, leadership and project management, before applying these skills in their own work.

FOR ARTISTS

Emerging artists are developing their own projects with the Northcott's guidance. They have opportunities to collaborate with peers and test material with live audiences. **Scratchworks Theatre Company** facilitates the Artist Play Spaces, a key part of this programme.

Weekly sessions are supplemented with monthly masterclasses delivered by Devonbased companies, including former Futures producer **Lucy Bell's Documental Theatre** and **Paddleboat Theatre Company.**


CHARTING A DIRECTION, TOGETHER

What is important to our city's different communities? What's missing, and what do they want to see more of? Where do they feel unseen and unheard? And how can we work together to make culture in Exeter more interesting, relevant, representative, accessible and appealing to anyone who lives here?

Last year we began a series of creative conversations with some of our city's cultural and heritage communities, looking for answers to these questions. In November, we gathered with members of Exeter and Devon's Hindu. Polish and Windrush communities. Supported by Devon Diversity Consultants, we spent two fantastic days together, exploring what culture means to us all and dreaming up ideas for future projects. Spending time at the Northcott as well as the Barnfield theatre buildings, we talked, laughed, played games, told stories, shared elements of our cultural heritage and kindled some brilliant ideas for future collaborations. Local visual artist Monic Shanta Brown joined us on our journey, encapsulating our thoughts and ideas in a stunning visual process map and a participatory performance piece. (We also, of course, ate a lot, courtesy of catering from the superb local Dinosaur Café.)

Climate change can no longer be viewed as a string of remote facts and figures. It's a crisis that's affecting us all, and we need an urgent conversation about that crisis. But the voices of young people, those most likely to be affected by the rise in global temperatures, are often absent from these conversations. *Footprints* is about making space for those voices here in Devon.


Yusuf Niazi, Associate Director at Exeter Northcott Theatre, has been working with a company of young performers to help them share their concerns about our collective future, and develop a story that shows the consequences of climate change for their generation.

The ordinary lives of the young characters in the play they've devised are turned upside down by extraordinary circumstances – memories distorted, the future polluted – and audiences are asked to consider some big questions about their own environmental responsibilities.

Staging this play now is reflective of our growing environmental awareness. At the Northcott, we're working to reduce our own carbon footprint, but we also recognise our responsibility as a cultural organisation to help frame conversations about the climate crisis and inspire individual change.

Footprints is the second collaboration between the Northcott and the University of Exeter's Drama Department, following last year's successful digital-only version of **Bertolt Brecht's** *Antigone*.

This is one of several projects and partnerships through which we support young people to develop their creative abilities and explore pathways into working within the arts. Next to collaborations with schools and colleges, we also run the Northcott Futures programme, which provides development opportunities for emerging South West-based theatre makers (see p.8)



It starts normally enough. Five friends meeting at university and beginning to navigate their way towards adult life. Together, they party, attempt to get jobs, form relationships, and try to find some stability in a chaotic world. But when an earth-shattering event disrupts everything they know, their lives change — possibly forever — prompting each of them to ask whether it'll ever possible to get back to the way things were?

Footprints is a brand-new piece of theatre, exploring the climate crisis and how we, as individuals, affect the world around us.

This production has been created in collaboration between a team of professional artists and students from University of Exeter's Drama Department, as part of Exeter Northcott Theatre's on-going commitment to supporting the next generation of theatre makers.


BY CAR






